# Kaunitz Yeung Architecture unveil new multi storey Brookvale childcare centre

The two-storey, learning and play area provides a highly efficient layout that maximises the number of children while eliminating corridors and maximising natural light and ventilation.

**David Kaunitz**, Director and cofounder of Kaunitz Yeung Architecture, said, "The design offers an innovative approach to multi storey childcare and creates a learning oasis in an urban environment.

"The building forms have been placed so that the roof of the floor below becomes the outdoor space of the floor above. The result is the creation of spaces that are light filled, naturally ventilated and with surrounding views that would not be possible in a single storey arrangement.

"The first floor of childcare is raised one storey above street level to lift the children out of the highly urbanised environment. Added to this the under-croft creates a sheltered outdoor space that protects from the sun and rain whilst being integrated with the architecture."

Talking about the Centre, Paisley Park Co-Founder **Kat Wieczorek-Ghisso** says, "Our learning environments, resources and curriculum are industry leading and so it was essential that we partner with a firm who could design and build an environment that would support the children's learning while helping fuel their imagination."

The official launch for Paisley Park Brookvale, will take place this Saturday 9<sup>th</sup> February with a Community Fun Day hosted by Paisley Park Creative Consultant and leading international chef from Network Ten's The Living Room, **Miguel Maestre**.

Kaunitz Yeung Architecture have built a strong reputation in collaborating with communities, stakeholders and end users to produce internationally recognised architecture within modest budgets that places people at the centre of buildings.

They have had a long association with leading community development projects, and their work has been awarded internationally as well as locally, including the 2018 NSW Architecture Awards.
